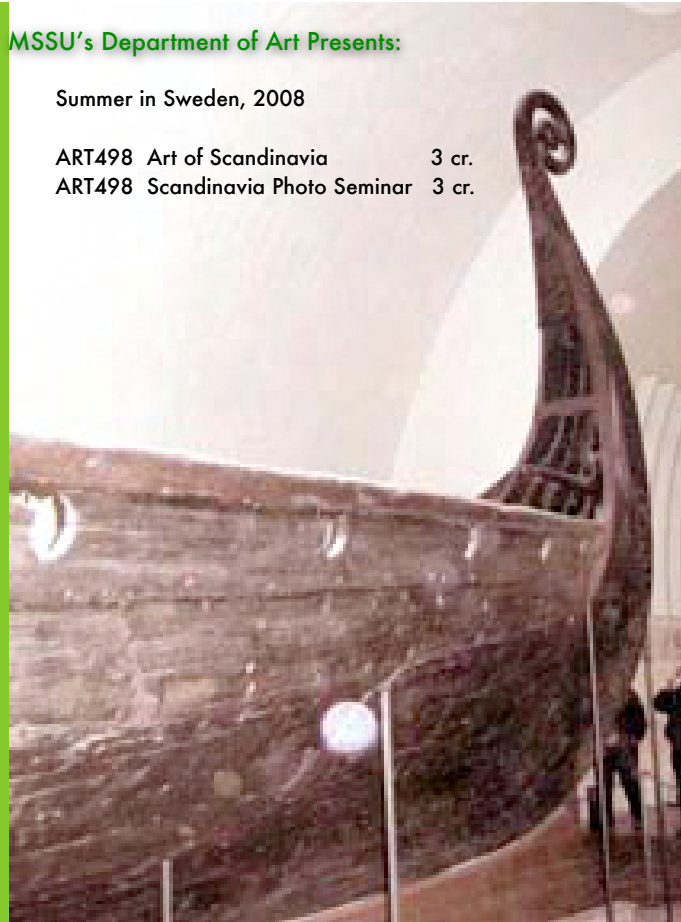

In accordance with our International Mission, the Missouri Southern State University Art Department's Study Abroad Program features a five week trip each summer. Join Professor June Roys this summer as we travel through Scandinavia studying Art.

This is an amazing opportunity to see historical and contemporary artworks created by some of the world's most renowned artists. See firsthand paintings by Edvard Munch in his native city, Oslo. Trace the influences of the Sculptor Rodin upon Norway's Gustave Vigeland and Sweden's Carl Milles. Study Viking artifacts and actual ships to gain insights on the cultural and artistic legacy that shaped and influences these lands.

Every year the MSSU Art Department travels to Sweden to study Scandinavian Art. During the week the students stay at the Mullsjo Folkaskola, a small Swedish People's College located in Central Sweden in a small resort village. During the weekends the group travels to several Scandinavian Capitals to study firsthand the rich artistic traditions of each Country. This five week summer trip is one of MSSU's most extensive study abroad opportunities.

While housed at the Folkaskola, MSSU students have the opportunity to study print (Black and White) photography with Orjan Henricksson, a world class studio photographer. The entire photographic process is covered; students learn to mix and handle the chemicals used in the process, how to develop their own film, how to use the enlargers to expose prints, and how to process the prints in the chemicals. Orjan works closely with the students to expand their understanding of how to compositionally frame photographs. At the end of the trip the students will have gained enough experience and taken enough photographs to have a group exhibition of their work at MSSU's own Spiva Gallery.

During the weekends the group travels to various art and cultural museums to see historical and contemporary artworks firsthand. Some of the highlights include; being able to go to the Edvard Munch Museum in Oslo, Norway to see firsthand the works by this pioneer in expressionistic painting, Tracing the artistic response and influence of the Sculptor August Rodin upon his scandinavian pupils Gustov Vigeland of Norway and Carl Milles of Sweden, and seeing the dynamic contemporary exhibitions of art in Denmark's Louisiana, Statens Museum, and Arken Museum. These chances to study at world-class institutions are an awesome opportunity and incredible experience for a student to gain an in depth understanding of what it means to create artwork in today's global society.

The trip also includes a week of stay at another great European Capital City to serve as a general background and contrasting element to help develop an understanding of Scandinavian versus European Art. This year's trip will be visiting Paris, France a city filled with amazing cultural and artistic treasures. Visiting the Louvre, Rodin's Garden, and the Pompidou, among other Museums will give the students a rich background of visual masterpieces to compare and contrast the Scandinavian art works against.
