Game 8: Missouri Southern State University Lions (5-2, 3-2 MIAA) vs. Central Missouri Mules (4-3, 3-2 MIAA)

Date: Saturday, October 20, 2007 Kickoff: 1:30 p.m.
Location: Warrensburg, Mo. • Audrey J. Walton Stadium (12,000)

THE COACHES: Bart Tatum is in his second season as head coach at Missouri Southern after spending 12 seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State. In his first season at Southern, Tatum led the Lions to a 5-6 record and a sixth place finish in the MIAA.

Under Tatum, the Lions produced the nation's best receiver in Colin Bado as Bado led Division II in receptions per game last season, racking up eight per contest. 2006 also saw the highest drafted Lion in program history as senior offensive tackle Allen Barbre went to the Green Bay Packers in the fourth round of the NFL Draft.

While at Northwest, Tatum helped the Bearcats to seven MIAA titles, eight NCAA Division II postseason appearances, three NCAA-II national title game appearances and two national championships.

He coached the Northwest offensive line for 10 seasons and served as recruiting coordinator for five years. Tatum was promoted to assistant head coach prior to the 2002 season, and he added the titles of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach prior to the 2004 campaign.

Under Tatum's guidance in 2004, the Bearcats fielded the nation's No. 2-ranked scoring offense and the No. 10 total offense. His charges ranked No. 21 nationally in rushing offense and 31st in passing offense. In 2005, Northwest ranked 23rd in the nation in passing offense.

The Bearcats went 118-35 during Tatum's stay, including 112-19 over the last 10 years.

Willie Fritz in his 11th year as the head coach at the University of Central Missouri, where he has compiled a career coaching record of 79-39.

UCM is the first four-year school that Fritz has coached. Prior to his arrival at Central, he led Blinn (Texas) Junior College to a 39-5-1 mark over a four-year span from 1993-96. In 13 years as a head coach, he's 113-38-1.

Fritz is 8-2 vs. the Lions for his career.

• On Sunday evenings at 7 p.m., campus television station KGCS (Cable One channel 7, MediaCom channel 77, UHF channel 57) will air a taped broadcast of the previous day's home game as part of Southern Sports Sunday.

• The weekly Bart Tatum Radio Show will air live from Buffalo Wild Wings each Thursday night at 7 pm. Kevin Greim will serve as host, while coach Tatum and his assistants will discuss the previous and upcoming games, as well as field questions from the crowd. THE SERIES: Missouri Southern holds the all-time series with an overall record of 14-12-2. The Lions have a 8-5-1 record at Hughes Stadium against the Mules. Central has won eight out of the last 11 meetings. Southern defeated the Mules last year at Hughes Stadium by the score of 31-26. It was the first win over Central in five games. From 1983-1996, the Lions were 7-2 against the Mules.

LIONS LAST TIME OUT: An Adam Hinspeter touchdown pass to Isaac Norman with 11:39 left in the fourth quarter would be the only scoring either team had and the Missouri Southern Lions defeated Fort Hays State today, 6-0 in front of more than 5,700 Homecoming fans at Fred G. Hughes Stadium.

Southern (5-2, 3-2 MIAA) started the game strong as Hinspeter hooked up with Norman on a 12 yard pass on the first play from scrimmage. However the Lions went three and out after that and forced an Ian Harrison punt.

After a Fort Hays' (3-4, 1-4 MIAA) punt, the Lions took the ball and both defenses came up strong. The Tigers' Cody Engle intercepted a Hinspeter pass and on the ensuing play, the Lions' Jamel Smith picked off a Shane Jackson pass.

Neither team would muster much offense the rest of the half as the score at the break would be tied at zero.

Southern's lone scoring drive of the game started late in the third quarter when Justin Cowper forced Tigers quarterback Shane Jackson to fumble the ball and Josh Woodard recovered the loose ball at the Southern 33. Hinspeter would complete four passes in a row, three to Colin Bado and one to Brandon McLaurin, before completing another two of three to Bado and McLaurin.

That put the ball on the FHSU 26 yard line when Alley Broussard rushed for six yards and a personal foul, face mask penalty at the end of the play gave the Lions the ball at the ten yard line. Hinspeter then hooked up with Norman for a ten yard catch in the endzone for the game's only score. Hays would threaten late, but a fourth down pass was tipped by Keith Wyatt, giving the Lions the ball back on downs.

Southern out gained Hays 345 to 213 in total offense, including just 274 all-purpose yards, the lowest total of the season.

Hinspeter was 24-39 with two interceptions and a touchdown for 222 yards on the night, including a long 44 yard pass to Norman. Bado caught 12 passes, just one off the Missouri Southern school record for receptions in a game, a record held by Rod Smith set against Truman State in 1993. Norman had five catches for 94 yards and a score. Broussard had 29 carries on the ground for 100 yards, his third 100 yard game of the season.

BJ Russow had ten tackles on the night, including 1.5 for a loss and two quarterback hurries. Corderial Collier had nine tackles and an interception, while Jared Brawner finished with eight stops.

THE DISH ON THE MULES: Central Missouri comes into today's game with a 4-3 record and they are 3-2 in the MIAA. Last week, the Mules had a chance to tie the game in the closing seconds at ninth ranked Northwest Missouri, but the two point conversion wasn't successful and the Mules lost to Northwest, 28-26.

The Mules have been very much a running team this season with running back Glenn Milner leading the team in rushing touchdowns with 12 on the season. Milner has rushed for 749 yards and ranks third in the MIAA in that category. He also ranks third in total offense.

Central has used two different quarterbacks this season with sophomore Eric Czerniewski seeing most of the time over University of Wyoming transfer Stinson Dean. Czerniewski has thrown for 887 yards on the season with nine TD's and four INT's. Senior defensive back Kendall Ricketts is seventh in the MIAA in tackles per game with an average of 8.4.

LION TIDBITS

A VICTORY VS. CENTRAL WOULD: give the Lions their first six win season since 1996. It would also be just the fourth win in the last 12 meetings with the Mules.

BADO GOES DOUBLE GRAND: Colin Bado caught five passes for 37 yards against Pitt State earlier in the season and went over 2,000 receiving yards in his career. He currently has 2,347 and is just the third Lion to accomplish that feat joining NFL Pro Bowler Rod Smith and Heath Helsel. Bado also caught 12 passes against Hays this past week, the second time in his career he's done that. It was just one off of the school record for receptions in a game.

NONE BETTER THAN BADO: Bado had 88 receptions last year, a Southern school record and with his current 210 career receptions, he has broken the career record of 158, previously held by current Denver Bronco, Rod Smith. Bado finished just 9 receptions shy from tying the MIAA record for receptions in a season of 97 set in 2004 by Emporia's JJ Richard. He is the only receiver in Missouri Southern history to catch 200 or more passes.

RUSHING YARDAGE GALORE: Through seven games this season, the Lions have already surpassed last year's rushing total of 934. Southern has rushed for 1,500 yards in three games this year and is 30th nationally in Division II in rushing yards per game.

NONE BETTER THAN HINSPETER: Junior quarterback Adam Hinspeter had 17 completions against Pittsburg State earlier in the season. That gave him 487 in his career and breaking the school record in that category. He had 24 completions against Fort Hays last week and currently has 591, breaking Josh Chapman's record of 484. With nine completions this week against Central, Hinspeter would become the only Lion in Southern history to complete 600 passes in a career.

NONE BETTER THAN HINSPETER II : Hinspeter threw for 191 yards against Wasburn last week two weeks ago, pushing him over the 6,000 yard plateau in his career. His 6,374 passing yards rank him second all time. He is 456 yards shy of Matt Cook's school record and is just 151 yards shy of cracking the MIAA Top Ten. His 6,337 yards of total offense rank him fourth.

Last Year's Game



PASSING UP THE COMPETITION: Adam Hinspeter had 16 consecutive completions to start the game earlier against Emporia State. That was just two off the MIAA record for consecutive completions. Hinspeter threw 148 consecutive passes without an interception last season, surpassing the previous school record of 113. His streak ended at Fort Hays.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: Alley Broussard is getting a lot of looks from the NFL scouts and national publications are noticing, as well. In an article on Sports Illustrated online on October 2, writer Tony Pauline listed Broussard as one of his draft board risers. Broussard has 633 yards and 8 touchdowns in six games this year.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Broussard ranks fourth in the MIAA in rushing yards per game (105.5), while ranking ninth in all-purpose yards. He also ranks fourth in scoring. Renard Johnson is seventh in rushing.

LEAGUE LEADERS II: Adam Hinspeter ranks fourth in passing efficiency among MIAA signal callers with a 129.2 rating. He is third in passing yards per game, while leading the MIAA in touchdowns with 14. Brian Malette ranks sixth in kick scoring and fifth in field goals. Colin Bado and Isaac Norman are second and fourth in receptions per game. Norman is fourth and Bado is fifth in receiving yards per game. Jared Brawner is third in tackles per game.

LEAGUE LEADERS III: Southern ranks third in total offense and first in total defense, while leading the MIAA in scoring defense and fifth in scoring offense. The team is third in the league in rushing and is third in passing efficiency.

LEAGUE LEADERS IV: The Lions are first in the MIAA in eight different offensive and defensive categories. Southern leads the league in scoring defense, total defense, pass defense efficiency, pass defense, opponent first downs (fewest), third down conversions, opponents third down conversions (lowest), and red zone defense.

2007 NATIONAL LEADERS: Southern, as a team, ranks 30th in rushing offense and 29th in total defense. The Lions are 38th in total offense and 17th in pass defense efficiency. They are 19th in passes intercepted (defense). Southern is 16th in the country in scoring defense.

2007 NATIONAL LEADERS II: Alley Broussard ranks 27th in rushing yards per game, while he is 34th nationally in scoring. Colin Bado is 16th in receptions per game, while Broussard ranks 37th in total rushing yards.

Joplin, MO -- The Missouri Southern defense had an interception, three forced fumbles, including a touchdown recovery by Devin Rutledge and defeated visiting Central Missouri 31-26 today.

Southern (4-4, 2-4 MIAA) went down 14-0 after two early touchdown passes from Central quarterback Toby Korrodi. The Lions took the ball and on the first possession of the second quarter, Adam Hinspeter hit Isaac Norman for an eight-yard touchdown pass to cut the lead in half.

Southern forced a five-play drive and a punt from UCM on its next possession and on a third and ten from the Central one-yard line, linebacker Johnny Berry stripped the ball and Devin Rutledge scrambled for the loose ball, picking it up in the endzone to tie the game.

Southern came out and forced a fumble on the opening kickoff and the Lions recovered on the Central four-yard line. Southern settled for a 20-yard field goal from Brian Malette and went on top, 17-14.

As was the story of the night, Southern's defense once again forced a turnover and after a completed pass, Skyler VanDiver forced the fumble and Mark Watson picked it up, rumbling to the Central four-yard line. Hinspeter completed the drive with a TD pass to Jonathon Terry, putting the Lions up 24-20.

After a Mule four and out, Southern's offense started from the Central 45 and drove the length with a Hinspeter touchdown pass to Noah Harding, putting the Lions up 31-10. The catch capped off an eight play, 45 yard drive.

Game 1 – Lions 51, @ Haskell 0 • August 30, 2007

Lawrence, Kan. - The Missouri Southern football team scored 51 points over the first three quarters and defeated Haskell University 51-0 in Lawrence last week. The win marked the 200th victory in the history of the program and was the first time Southern has shut out an opponent since 2002, when the Lions defeated Greenville, 63-0 in the season opener.

The Lions (1-0) took the opening drive of the game and went 57 yards on six plays resulting in a 28 yard field goal from Brian Malette. Southern then brought out the defense and in Haskell's first possession, Elbert Johnson and David Benham stopped Haskell running back Quentin Haynes twice for a loss, forcing the Indians (0-1) to punt the ball.

Southern went to the ground for the next drive. Renard Johnson had back-to-back carries for 16 and 14 yards, followed by three rushes by Ronnell Newman totaling 35 yards, before fullback Anthon Aiono hurdled his way into the end zone for a 1 yard touchdown. The score for Aiono was the first of his career and was one of six Southern touchdowns on the night that were the first career touchdowns for those specific individuals.

Neither team would score the rest of the first quarter, but with 10:38 of the second, Toderick Hunt went in from five and gave the Lions a 17-0 lead.

The Lions defense came up strong again on the very next possession and on the first play from scrimmage, Justin Cowper came in on a blitz and forced a hurried pass from Victor Ramos allowing Jordan Patton to pick it off for the first of three Lions interceptions on the night.

Southern would waste no time to score again and facing a third and eight, Adam Hinpeter hooked up with Tony Edwards for a 62 yard touchdown pass putting the Lions up 24-0. Renard Johnson added a six yard TD run, the first of his career, while Johnny Johnson added his first career TD reception with a five yard grab to put the Lions up 37-0 at the half.

Quarterback Roland Thompson started the second half for the Lions getting his first taste of collegiate action and wasted no time as in his second series, the New Orleans native hooked up with Jeremiah Jones for the first of two TD passes on the night, hitting the freshman for an eight yard score with 7:31 left in the third. The two hooked up again with 3:15 left in the third, this time for a 38 yard TD score.

Southern out-gained Haskell 587-121 on the night and forced three turnovers. The Lions had 27 first downs to Haskell's seven, two of which came via Southern penalties. Southern scored 6-7 times in the red zone tonight.

Renard Johnson rushed for 148 yards on eight carries, including a long of 44 for an average of 18.5 per touch. He scored once. Hunt carried the ball 19 times for 109 yards and a score, while Ronnell Newman picked up 73 yards on six carries. Hinpeter was 9-17 for 110 yards and two TD's, while Thompson was 6-7 for 80 yards and two TD's in the second half.

Freshman Jacob Kirksey led the Lions with six tackles, including a sack and a forced fumble for a loss of seven yards. Elbert Johnson had five tackles, including two for a loss and a pass breakup, while Jordan Patton and Kellen Anderson each picked up an interception.

Game 2 – @ Lions 48, Harding 20 • September 8, 2007

Joplin, Mo. - Adam Hinpeter threw for 215 yards and four touchdowns leading the Missouri Southern Lions to a 48-20 win over Harding University in the 2007 Southern home opener at Fred G. Hughes Stadium.

The Lions (2-0) scored the game's first 14 points as Hinpeter hit Isaac Norman and Korie Henry in the first 10 minutes of the game.

The Lions added another score from Hinpeter to Norman, this time a 22 yard score to go up 21-0. A 45 yard field goal from Brian Malette, tying his career high, as well as a 67-yard touchdown pass to Bado and a 37 yard interception return for a touchdown from Corderial Collier gave the Lions a 38-7 lead at the half.

Harding (1-1) committed four first-half turnovers, including three interceptions thrown by Bison junior quarterback David Knighton.

Hinpeter threw for 168 yards and four touchdowns on 12-16 passing in the first half. Renard Johnson had 13 rushes for 82 yards, while LSU transfer Alley Broussard saw his first action as a Lion and scampered for 71 yards on nine carries in the first half.

Broussard would get his first touchdown as a Lion eight minutes into the second half, as he broke three different tackles and ran for pay dirt collecting on a 39 yard score. The Lions added another field goal from Malette, this time a 35 yarder, to go up 48-14. A late touchdown from Harding would put the final score at 48-20.

Broussard broke numerous tackles on the night and rushed for 110 yards on 10 carries with a TD. Johnson ended up with 84 yards on 15 carries. Bado had 95 yards on six catches, while Norman caught five passes for 87 yards.

The Lions had 463 yards of total offense including 245 on the ground. Southern was 2-2 in fourth down conversions, as well as a perfect 2-2 in the red zone.

The Southern defense limited Harding to 305 yards of offense on the night and forced five turnovers (three interceptions and two fumble recoveries). Jared Brawner had 13 tackles, including a half a sack he shared with Skyler Vandiver. Vandiver had three tackles on the night including a fumble recovery.

Rudy Mascaro had ten tackles with two for a loss of 11 yards. Mascaro and Josh Woodard both had sacks as the Lions sacked Harding quarterback David Knighton three times on the night. BJ Russow had four tackles including three quarterback hurries. Justin Cowper and Jordan Patton both had interceptions for Southern.

The Lions will start their MIAA schedule next week and play host to Pittsburg State in the tenth annual US Cellular Miners Bowl at Fred G Hughes Stadium Kick off is slated for 6 pm. on Saturday.

Game 3 – #6 Pittsburg State 31, @ Lions 28 • September 15, 2007

Joplin, Mo. - Alley Broussard ran for 173 yards and four touchdowns, but the Missouri Southern football team lost a heartbreaker tonight, falling 31-28 to sixth ranked Pittsburg State in front of more than 9,000 fans at Hughes Stadium in the tenth annual US Cellular Miner's Bowl.

Southern (2-1, 0-1 MIAA) racked up 300 yards rushing for the second game this season as both Broussard and Renard Johnson reached the century mark. Johnson ran for 132 on on 16 carries.

After a Pitt State (3-0, 1-0 MIAA) three and out, Southern started from their own 33 with 4:50 left in the half. Broussard promptly put the Lions on the board as the LSU transfer broke open on the far sideline and ran for 67 yards and a score cutting the PSU lead to 10-7 at the half. Broussard had 118 yards of Southern's 193 at the half.

The Gorillas started quick in the second half as quarterback Mark Smith and running back Caleb Ferabi moved the ball down the field with ease, and PSU took up over six minutes off the clock on their first drive of the half, culminating in a two yard touchdown run from Smith.

The fourth quarter would be all Southern as the Lions outscored PSU 21-7. Broussard would cap off a 16 play drive that took up over seven minutes off the clock with his second TD of the game, cutting the lead to ten at 24-14. After a 40 yard Ferabi TD run to put PSU up 31-14, Broussard added his third touchdown of the game, this one a two-yarder, cutting the lead to ten once again.

After the Southern defense forced a PSU turnover on downs, quarterback Adam Hinspeter completed four passes and the Lions went for it on 4th and seven. The pass was incomplete, but PSU was flagged for a pass interference and on the next play Broussard added his fourth touchdown of the game. That would be all Southern could get, however, as time ran out on the comeback.

Southern beat Pitt in almost every offensive category including rushing yards (302-295), passing yards (102-71), and total yards (404-366), but a key interception and nine penalties for 76 yards hurt the Lions in the end.

Colin Bado caught five passes for 37 yards and went over 2,000 receiving yards in his career. He is just the third Lion to accomplish that feat joining NFL Pro Bowler Rod Smith and Heath Helsel. Rudy Mascaro had 16 tackles, including two for a loss, while Jared Brawner had 14 tackles and a half a sack. He teamed with Jamel Smith on a sack of Smith.

Game 4 – Lions 16, @ Southwest Baptist 16 • September 22, 2007

Bolivar, Mo. -- The Missouri Southern football team scored 14 unanswered points in the second half and came from behind to win 17-16 at Southwest Baptist tonight.

Southern (3-1, 1-1 MIAA) came into the game ranked as the number one offense in the MIAA and the third best rushing offense in Division II, but could only manage 71 yards in the first quarter, including just 13 on the ground.

The Lions scored first as Brian Malette nailed a 22 yard field goal just four minutes in. SBU (0-4, 0-2 MIAA) answered back with a 29-yard Jeremy Ware field goal with seven minutes left in the quarter.

The Bearcats' defensive back Lorenzo Head put SBU on top in the second quarter when he picked off an Adam Hinspeter pass and went 24 yards to paydirt for the touchdown, giving SBU a 10-7 lead at the half.

SBU led Southern 162-150 in total offense in the first half, while the Lions managed just 16 yards on the ground.

The second half Missouri Southern re-gained the game momentum. After an SBU touchdown to give the Bearcats a 16-3 lead, Southern rolled off 14 straight points, led by Hinspeter touchdown passes to Anthon Aiono and Colin Bado.

SBU would put one last drive together as quarterback Steve Gaschette threw three different passes for over 20 yards to set up a 32 yard field goal attempt from Ware with no time remaining, but a low snap led to a bad kick and the Lions escaped with the win.

Alley Broussard rushed for 67 yards on 14 rushes, all in the fourth quarter. Renard Johnson had 65 yards on 17 carries. Hinspeter threw for 248 yards and two touchdowns on 26-40 with two interceptions.

Jared Brawner had eight tackles, including an interception for 46 yards. Elbert Johnson had five tackles and two sacks, while Zach McFerren added his first sack of his career.

Southern rebounded to record 349 yards of total offense, including 101 yards on the ground.

Game 5 – @ Lions 42 - Emporia State 19 • September 29, 2007

Joplin, Mo. - Adam Hinpeter threw for 267 yards on 28-33 passing and had three touchdowns as the Missouri Southern football team defeated the visiting Emporia State Hornets 42-19 tonight at Fred G. Hughes Stadium.

Southern (4-1, 2-1) move to 4-1 for the first time since the 2002 season. The Lions scored early and often in the first quarter collecting touchdowns on their first two drives of the game. Renard Johnson rushed for a 37 yard score for the Lions first points, while Alley Broussard rushed for 46 yards on four carries including a two yard score on the second drive to put Southern up 14-0.

Broussard put the Lions up 21-7 when he broke open for a 40 yard score on a fourth and one with just under three minutes remaining in the half. The Lions' defense came up strong on the next drive. The Hornets had marched the ball to the Southern 24 yard line but the defense forced a fourth and six, which ESU went for. An Andre Sloan El pass was incomplete turning the ball over on downs.

With 1:25 left in the half, the Lions were facing a third and 16 with 29 seconds left on the clock, but Hinpeter hooked up with Isaac Norman for a 46 yard pass to the ESU nine yard line. An ESU face mask penalty gave the Lions five more yards, and Hinpeter found Colin Bado in the endzone to make the halftime score 28-7.

Hinpeter was 20-22 in the first half and at one time had completed his first 16 passes in a row, just two off the MIAA record.

ESU had the only score of the third quarter when Sloan El hit Paul Nichols for a 12 yard touchdown pass. The Hornets, however, botched the snap on the extra point and the score stood 28-13.

The Lions added two more touchdown passes from Hinpeter in the fourth quarter, a five yard catch for Norman and a 17 yard score to tight end Korie Henry. A late 29 yard TD rush from the Hornets' Justin Weiser made the final score 42-19 after the two point conversion failed.

The Lions gained 210 yards on the ground tonight led by 149 from Renard Johnson. Broussard had five carries for 86 yards, while Ronnell Newman had 14 yards late for Southern. Hinpeter threw for three touchdowns and 267 yards and was 28-33 for an 84 percent completion percentage. He holds the school record, which he set when he was 19-20 in his first collegiate game against Harding two years ago.

Game 6 – @ Washburn 26 - Lions 20 • October 6, 2007

Topeka, Kan. - The Missouri Southern football team had the ball on the Washburn 15 yard line, threatening with 2:23 left in the fourth quarter, but an interception by Washburn's Cary Williams in the end zone helped seal a 26-20 Washburn win in Topeka.

Southern (4-2, 2-2 MIAA) started its last drive with 6:26 left in the game at their own 49 yard line when Jordan Patton blocked a Washburn punt. Alley Broussard had four runs for 29 yards, before a two yard rush from Renard Johnson put the ball at the Washburn 15. Adam Hinpeter took the snap and rolled left, but his pass was picked by Williams at the goal line and returned 36 yards to stop the Southern drive.

Washburn (4-2, 3-1 MIAA) took the ball and had a fourth and three from the Southern 33, but Brandon Walker reeled off a 17 yard run to the Southern 16 to seal the win for the Ichabods.

The Lions got on the board with 1:45 left in the first quarter when Hinpeter hit Brandon McLaurin for a 16 yard touchdown catch. Hinpeter completed passes of 22 and 33 yards to Colin Bado and Isaac Norman, respectively in the drive.

Coming out of the half, the Lions defense came alive again when BJ Russow blocked a 28 yard field goal attempt that went into the end zone to give the Lions the ball back at the Southern 20. Broussard had five rushes for 39 yards on the drive, before he scampered in from the one yard line to put the Lions up 20-17 with

Washburn answered right back when after a 70 yard Brian Malette kickoff into the Washburn end zone, Williams again showed up big and returned the kick 100 yards to put the Ichabods up 24-20. Washburn would add a late safety to make the final score 26-20.

Broussard rushed for 98 yards on 20 carries with a touchdown. Hinpeter had two TD's on 21-35 and 191 yards. Colin Bado had six receptions for 65 yards in the game and now has 198 receptions in his career. Brian Malette had six kickoffs for 395 yards and an average of 65.8 per kick with two touchbacks.

Williams had a banner day for the Ichabods. The senior transfer from Fordham University had a touchdown reception for 68 yards, a 100 yard kickoff return for a touchdown and a game-saving interception return for 36 yards on Southern's final drive. He ended the game with 226 of all-purpose yardage.

Game 7 – @ Lions 6 - Fort Hays State 0 • October 13, 2007

Joplin, MO -- An Adam Hinspeter touchdown pass to Isaac Norman with 11:39 left in the fourth quarter would be the only scoring either team had and the Missouri Southern Lions defeated Fort Hays State today, 6-0 in front of more than 5,700 Homecoming fans at Fred G. Hughes Stadium.

Southern (5-2, 3-2 MIAA) started the game strong as Hinspeter hooked up with Norman on a 12 yard pass on the first play from scrimmage. However the Lions went three and out after that and forced an Ian Harrison punt.

After a Fort Hays' (3-4, 1-4 MIAA) punt, the Lions took the ball and both defenses came up strong. The Tigers' Cody Engle intercepted a Hinspeter pass and on the ensuing play, the Lions' Jamel Smith picked off a Shane Jackson pass.

Neither team would muster much offense the rest of the half as the score at the break would be tied at zero.

Southern's lone scoring drive of the game started late in the third quarter when Justin Cowper forced Tigers quarterback Shane Jackson to fumble the ball and Josh Woodard recovered the loose ball at the Southern 33. Hinspeter would complete four passes in a row, three to Colin Bado and one to Brandon McLaurin, before completing another two of three to Bado and McLaurin.

That put the ball on the FHSU 26 yard line when Alley Broussard rushed for six yards and a personal foul, face mask penalty at the end of the play gave the Lions the ball at the ten yard line. Hinspeter then hooked up with Norman for a ten yard catch in the endzone for the game's only score. Hays would threaten late, but a fourth down pass was tipped by Keith Wyatt, giving the Lions the ball back on downs.

Southern out gained Hays 345 to 213 in total offense, including just 274 all-purpose yards, the lowest total of the season.

Hinspeter was 24-39 with two interceptions and a touchdown for 222 yards on the night, including a long 44 yard pass to Norman. Bado caught 12 passes, just one off the Missouri Southern school record for receptions in a game, a record held by Rod Smith set against Truman State in 1993. Norman had five catches for 94 yards and a score. Broussard had 29 carries on the ground for 100 yards, his third 100 yard game of the season.

BJ Russow had ten tackles on the night, including 1.5 for a loss and two quarterback hurries. Corderial Collier had nine tackles and an interception, while Jared Brawner finished with eight stops.
