**Game 11: Missouri Southern State University Lions (4-6, 2-6 MIAA) vs. #3 Northwest Missouri Bearcats (9-1, 8-0 MIAA)**

**Date:** Saturday, November 8, 2008 **Kickoff:** 2:00 p.m.  
**Location:** Joplin, Mo. - Fred G. Hughes Stadium (7,000)

**THE COACHES:** Bart Tatum is in his third season as head coach at Missouri Southern after spending 12 seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State. In his two seasons at Southern, Tatum has led the Lions to an 15-17 record and two sixth place finishes in the MIAA.

Under Tatum, the Lions have produced one of the nation's best receiver in Colin Bado as Bado led Division II in receptions per game in 2006, racking up eight per contest. 2006 also saw the highest drafted Lion in program history as senior offensive tackle Allen Barbre went to the Green Bay Packers in the fourth round of the NFL Draft. In 2007, the Lions had the program's first winning record in ten years, finishing 6-5.

While at Northwest, Tatum helped the Bearcats to seven MIAA titles, eight NCAA Division II postseason appearances, three NCAA-II national title game appearances and two national championships.

He coached the Northwest offensive line for 10 seasons and served as recruiting coordinator for five years. Tatum was promoted to assistant head coach prior to the 2002 season, and he added the titles of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach prior to the 2004 campaign.

The Bearcats went 118-35 during Tatum's stay, including 112-19 over the last 10 years.

**Mel Tjeerdsma** is in his 15th year as head coach at Northwest Missouri State, and he has posted a 153-39 won-lost record. He led the Bearcats to national titles in 1999 and 2000 and a runner up finish the last two seasons. He has been named MIAA Coach of the Year nine times in his career, including the honor in 2007. Now in the 25th year of his collegiate head coaching career, Tjeerdsma is 212-77-4.

Kevin Greim will serve as host, while coach Tatum and his assistants will discuss the previous and upcoming games, as well as field questions from the crowd. **THE SERIES:** Northwest holds a 15-4 record against the Lions and Southern is 1-13 against the Bearcats in Tjeerdsma's tenure. Southern won the first matchup in 1994, 34-9 at Hughes Stadium, the only win at home in the series. Southern is 3-8 in Maryville, but haven't beat the Bearcats since 1994. Since 1998, the average margin of victory for Northwest has been 34 points.

**LIONS LAST TIME OUT:** Missouri Southern's offense struggled today and the Truman State University Bulldogs used 28 second half points to defeat the Lions, 38-7 in Kirksville.

Southern (4-6, 2-6 MIAA) started the game on the right foot with Fred Smith taking the opening kickoff back 49-yards to the Truman (4-5, 3-5 MIAA) 46 yard line. The drive was short lived, however, as Truman's Robert Massop picked off an Adam Hinspeter pass. The Bulldogs would make the turnover hurt and they ended a nine play, 61-yard drive with a 15-yard touchdown run from Phil Kenney.

Truman added a 27-yard Mickey Masucci field goal to make the score 10-0 with 3:36 left in the first quarter. Neither team moved the ball well in the second quarter, but the Lions were threatening as the half was coming to an end and moved the ball to the Truman 27-yard line. Southern converted a fourth down on the drive, but the Bulldogs would stop the threat as Matt Burel intercepted a Hinspeter pass at the 10-yard line.

Southern had eight penalties for 60 yards in the first half, including a 61-yard punt return from Johnny Johnson called back due to a block in the back.

Truman came into the game averaging 103 yards per game on the ground, but the Bulldogs rushed for 200 yards in the first half, including 112 yards from Anton Bernard, becoming the first 100-yard rusher for Truman this season. In contrast, Ticich came into the game averaging 217 yards per game through the air, but the junior completed just 2-10 passes for 12 yards in the first half. The second half was much different for Ticich, as he completed nine of his first 11 passes 138 yards and three touchdowns putting the Bulldogs up 31-0 with 13 minutes left in the fourth quarter.

The Lions added a touchdown pass from Hinspeter to Isaac Norman before Truman backup quarterback Phillip Davis hooked up with Deotis Brown for the games' final score.

Hinspeter went 29-46 for 303 yards and a touchdown today. He currently has 8,817 yards passing, placing him 280 yards from second place in the MIAA. Hinspeter has 8,693 yards of total offense, putting him just 108 yards away from tying Josh Chapman's school record of 8,801.

Johnny Johnson had a career game catching nine passes for 130 yards, while Norman caught seven for 80 yards and a touchdown. Brian Malette placed himself among the kicking elite in Southern history connecting on his only point after attempt of the day, but it gave him 39 consecutive PAT's and placed him atop the Southern record books.

Jared Brawner had a game-high 12 tackles in the game with a pass break up. Corderial Collier had ten tackles and Brandon Williams had a career-high nine stops.

**THE DISH ON THE BEARCATS:** Northwest is the best team in the MIAA this season, already having clinched a share of their 22nd conference title in the program's history. The Bearcats suffered a season opening loss to then No. 8, now No. 2 ranked Abilene Christian, 44-27 at home, but have since reeled off nine consecutive wins including big wins in consecutive weeks over then fifth ranked Nebraska-Omah, 6th ranked Pittsburg State and 17th ranked Central Missouri. The wins at UNO and Central were both on the road.

LaRon Council leads the Bearcats offense and is a Harlon Hill candidate this season. The senior running back has 1,131 yards on the ground and 22 touchdowns. Joel Osborn throws for 230 yards per game in the air and has 19 touchdowns this season, with four each coming to Kendall Wright and Abe Qaoud. Defensively, Aldwin Foster-Rettig, Adam Vondrak and Ike Uram-Eke lead the Bearcats attack.

Northwest ranks first in the MIAA in 11 different categories including scoring offense and defense, pass offense, pass defense efficiency, rushing defense, total offense, total defense, punt return average, first downs, sacks and third down conversions.

**LION TIDBITS**

**A VICTORY VS. NORTHWEST WOULD:** be the first in the last 15 games against the Bearcats

**HINSPETER'S MIAA COMPLETION LEADER:** Senior quarterback Adam Hinspeter has 149 completions this season, including 26 in week one in his record-setting performance against Harding. He had 17 against Nebraska-Omaha, putting him atop the MIAA's All-Time Completions list. Hinspeter currently has 824, putting him in front of former Missouri Western quarterback Kasey Waterman (730). He also passed Waterman in total attempts last week and is the MIAA all-time leader with 1,331.

**NONE BETTER THAN HINSPETER:** Hinspeter threw for a school record 422 yards and tied another record with five touchdowns against Harding in week one. He currently has 59 touchdowns in his career, just nine off the school record held by Matt Cook. His 8,817 passing yards in his 280 yards away from second place all-time in the MIAA. Hinspeter is just the third quarterback in MIAA history with 8,000 or more yards passing.

**PASSING UP THE COMPETITION:** Hinspeter had 418 yards of total offense in week one against Harding. He currently has 8,693 for his career and is in second-place all-time at Southern, just 108 behind Josh Chapman and has passed former Washburn signal caller Tyler Shuermann (8,315) to move into fifth place all-time in the MIAA for total offense.

**SHORT STRIKES:** The Lions have had six one-play scoring drives this season with each lasting 10 seconds or less. They have had seven scoring drives under one minute and 14 under two minutes. Only six scoring drives all season have been 10 plays or more.

**KICKING ACCURACY:** Already holding the Southern season record for consecutive extra points, Brian Malette has the career record of 39 passing

## LION TIDBITS PT. II

**MIAA LEADERBOARD:** Southern ranks in the MIAA's top three in eight different statistical categories, including: pass defense efficiency (3rd), total defense (3rd), kickoff returns (2nd), pass defense (1st), opponents first downs (2nd), opponent fourth down conversions (1st), and pat kicking (1st).

**NATIONAL LEADERBOARD:** Southern ranks 10th nationally in pass defense and 54th in pass defense eff., while ranking 17th in kick-off returns. Jared Brawner is 14th in tackles and Jordan Patton, although gone for the year with an injury, ranks 13th in kickoff returns.

**Maryville, Mo.** - The Missouri Southern football team scored first, but fifth ranked Northwest Missouri scored 42 unanswered points and defeated the Lions 49-14 in the season finale at Mel Tjeerdsmas field at Bearcat Stadium today in Maryville.

Southern (6-5, 4-5 MIAA) opened the scoring with a 30 yard pass from Adam Hinspeter to Colin Bado with just 10 seconds left in the first quarter. Hinspeter, on that drive, went over 2,000 yards passing this season, making him the only quarterback in Missouri Southern history to pass for 2,000 yards in a season three times.

Northwest (9-1, 9-0 MIAA) answered back when Xavier Omon rumbled in for a one yard score to cap off a six play, 74 yard scoring drive. Omon on the play became the only player in Division II history to rush for 1,500 yards four different times in a career.

The Bearcats added a score when they blocked a Brian Malette punt and Brian Shannon returned the ball 16 yards into the endzone. A 26 yard pass from Joel Osborn to Mike Peterson put Northwest up 21-7 and another Omon score, this time a 15 yard rush, put the Bearcats up 28-7. Ryan Jones put Northwest up 35-7 with just 41 seconds to play in the half, when Bado was hit over the middle and fumbled. Jones picked up the loose ball and ran 72 yards for the score.

Northwest added another passing score, before Anthon Aiono picked up a one yard rushing touchdown, capping off a 16 play drive and making the score 42-14 just a few minutes into the fourth quarter. Northwest added one last score with five minutes left.

Turnovers were the story of the day for the Lions offense. Two fumbles were returned for a score, while Hinspeter was sacked four times and intercepted once.

Hinspeter did venture his way up the record books for both Southern and the MIAA today. His 198 passing yards on the day give the junior 6,993 on his career, ranking him first all-time at Southern and sixth in the MIAA. His 22 completions give him 677 in his career, also a Southern record and moves him to third in the conference. He finished the season with 2,105 yards of total offense giving him 7,112 in his career and moving into second place on the all time list just behind Josh Chapman.

Colin Bado caught 11 passes for 115 yards and a score. The 11 passes give him 84 on the season and give him the top two single season totals at Southern. The 84 passes raise his career Southern record to 250, placing him third all-time in the MIAA and 13th all time in Division II history. His 905 receiving yards give him 2,789 in his career, trailing only Southern hall of famer and current Denver Bronco, Rod Smith (3,122).

Game 1 – @ Lions 41 - Harding 35 • August 30, 2008

Lawrence, Kan. - Adam Hinspeter threw for a school record 422 yards and tied another school record with five touchdowns as the Missouri Southern football team defeated visiting Harding, 45-31 in the Lions season opener. The win is the fifth season opening win in a row for Southern.

Southern (1-0) scored the game's first points after Jared Brawner recovered a Harding fumble forced by David Benham. Hinspeter promptly hooked up with Mark Henderson on a 14 yard touchdown pass.

Harding (0-1) tied the game on its next possession when Jeremy Holt rushed for a four-yard score.

Brian Malette connected on a 44 yard field goal just three minutes into the second quarter to put the Lions back on top for good. Hinspeter hooked up with Henderson again on the Lions' next possession, this time for 35 yards, putting Southern up 17-7. Hinspeter picked up touchdown number three when he hit Chris Bingham with a three yard pass to put the Lions up 24-7. Harding added a 20-yard David Knighton touchdown pass with 54 seconds left in the half to make the halftime score 24-14.

Harding added a 22 yard field goal to cut the lead to 24-17 at the start of the third quarter, but that would be as close as the Bisons would get. Hinspeter hooked up with Daniel Thompson for Thompson's first career touchdown and Ronnell Newman added a three yard rush for pay dirt to give the Lions a 38-24 lead at the end of the third quarter. Hinspeter then hooked up with Henderson for the third time, this time a 44 yard catch for the Lions' final score. The Lions had sacks from Jarius Jarvis and David Benham on Harding's final possession.

The Lions had 551 yards of total offense tonight with Hinspeter accounting for 422 of that through the air. Hinspeter's 422 yards passing is the most since Nathan Emert threw for 419 in 2005 against Bacone. His five touchdowns ties a school record with Matt Cook (Truman 1993). Henderson had 228 yards on nine catches with three touchdowns. He also added a 22 yard rush on an end around.

Renard Johnson and Newman rushed for 53 and 42 yards, respectively. Johnny Johnson had 83 yards on six catches, while Thompson had 54 yards on four catches with a touchdown. The Lions' special teams knew they needed to step up their game this season and step it up they did tonight. Ian Harrison and Hinspeter combined for five punts for an average of 41.4 yards with two inside the 20. Malette was perfect with five extra points and one field goal.

The Southern defense showed up strong again, forcing two turnovers and recording three sacks on the night. Jared Brawner had nine tackles, a pass break up and a fumble recovery. Skyler Vandiver had seven solo tackles and a break up, while Justin Cowper had seven tackles. Benham, Jarvis and Keith Wyatt all had a sack. Corderial Collier picked up an interception, while Benham forced a fumble.

Game 2 – @ Lions 66 - Haskell 9 • Sept. 4, 2008

Joplin, Mo. - Freshman quarterback Colin Howard and junior running back Toderick Hunt rushed for three touchdowns each as the Missouri Southern Lions racked up 404 yards on the ground with eight rushing scores, defeating visiting Haskell, 66-9 tonight at Fred G. Hughes Stadium.

Southern (2-0) tied a school record with eight rushing touchdowns in the game, matching the previous mark set in 1982 against Evangel. The Lions were also two points from tying the school record for points in a game (1982, Evangel).

The Lions' defense set up the first points of the game for the second-straight week when Jordan Patton intercepted the first pass from scrimmage and returned it to the Haskell (0-2) one-yard line. Quarterback Adam Hinspeter then took the ball in with a quarterback sneak to score the Lions' first points.

Southern added a two yard rushing touchdown from El Reo Smith, the first of his career, as well as a 29-yard field goal from Brian Malette to end the first quarter with a 17-0 lead. After a 19-yard punt return from Fred Smith to the Southern 33, Hinspeter hooked up with Isaac Norman for a 67-yard strike to give the Lions a 24-0 lead.

Hunt picked up the first of his three touchdowns with a five-yard carry to make the score 31-0, before Haskell added its only touchdown of the game with a 67-yard rushing score from Quentin Haynes. Howard and the Lions answered right back and the freshman from Webb City rushed for 30 yards and a score on his first touch of the night, to make the half-time score 38-7.

Howard rushed for two more scores in the third before a snap sailed over punter Ian Harrison's head and out of the end zone giving the Indians a safety and made the score 52-9. Hunt added two more rushing touchdowns in the fourth to bring the final score to 66-9.

The Lions rushed for 404 yards on the night. They passed the ball just 11 times, but went 7-11 in the air with one score.

Hunt ended the night with 21 carries for 175 yards and three touchdowns. Howard had 105 yards on seven carries and three scores, while Smith and Hinspeter added a rushing touchdown each. Malette was perfect on the night with a 29-yard field goal and was 9-9 on point after attempts.

The Southern defense limited Haskell to just four first downs on the night, 66 yards rushing and 48 yards passing. They forced four fumbles, recovering one, while forcing the Indians to punt nine times. Marcus Cook led the Lions with six tackles, as 26 different Lions recorded at least one tackle tonight. Patton had an interception, a forced fumble, a pass break up and one quarterback hurry, while Cruz Johnson, Josh Woodard and Jovan Alexander all recorded sacks.

Game 3 – @ #7 Pittsburg State 21, Lions 14 • September 13, 2008

**Pittsburg, Kan.** - A two yard touchdown toss from Mark Smith to Marques Nelson with 16.5 seconds left gave the seventh ranked Pittsburg State Gorillas a 21-14 win over Missouri Southern tonight in the Miners Bowl in Pittsburg.

Southern (2-1, 0-1 MIAA) moved the ball to their own 42 on its first possession, before punting away. The Lion defense came up strong on Pitt's first possession, and forced the Gorillas to a three and out and a quick punt. Southern then had their most productive drive of the first half as Renard Johnson had runs of 10 and 23 yards, his second to the PSU nine yard line. The Lions, however, would fumble the ball for their first turnover of the half.

PSU (3-0, 1-0 MIAA) took the ball and drove to the Southern one yard line before the first quarter ended. The Gorillas' Caleb Ferabi then took the first play of the second quarter and dove over the goal line to give Pitt a 7-0 lead.

The Southern defense stopped two Pitt State drives coming out of the locker room and on the Lions' second possession of the half, Southern got on the board. After rushes from Toderick Hunt and Johnson moved the ball to the Southern 36, Hinpeter hooked up with Korie Henrie for a 39 yard catch over the middle to move the Lions to the Pitt State 25 yard line. Hinpeter then hit Isaac Norman on the next play for a 25-yard score to tie the game at seven.

After a Pitt State punt put the Lions at their own five yard line, the Lions fumbled the ball and Pitt capitalized with a touchdown pass from Smith to Nelson to put the Gorillas up 14-7 with just under three minutes left in the third quarter.

Another Pitt State Fumble gave the Lions the ball back and Southern would use a pass from Hinpeter to Henry and a two yard touchdown run from Johnson to tie the game at 14 with just under three minutes left.

A kick out of bounds gave PSU the ball on the 40. Smith and the Gorillas drove the length of the field and a touchdown pass to Nelson, with 16 seconds remaining gave PSU the 21-14 win.

Hinpeter was 14-31 for 176 yards and a touchdown on the night. Johnson had 17 carries for 82 yards and a score. Henrie caught three passes for 62 yards, while Norman had 52 yards over three receptions and a touchdown. Skyler Vandiver led the Lions with 11 tackles on the night, while Corderial Collier had nine tackles, an interception and a pass break-up. Antwan Dyer and Jared Brawner had nine and eight tackles, respectively.

Game 4 – UNO 40 - @ Lions 21 • September 20, 2008

**Joplin, Mo.** - Fifth-ranked Nebraska-Omaha led 30-7 at halftime, and despite the Missouri Southern Lions scoring on their first two possessions of the second half, rolled to a 40-21 victory tonight at Fred G. Hughes Stadium.

Southern (2-2, 0-2 MIAA) saw senior quarterback Adam Hinpeter become the MIAA's all-time leader in completions tonight, as his 17 put him at 735 for his career, passing former Missouri Western quarterback Kasey Watterman (730).

UNO (3-0, 2-0 MIAA) remains undefeated and posted the highest number of total yards (528) and rushing offense (388) against a Southern defense since 2005 when Washburn put up 382 on the ground and 583 total.

The Mavericks got on the board first when kicker Greg Zuerlein booted a 42-yarder on UNO's first possession to give them a 3-0 lead. UNO added four more touchdowns in the second quarter, including three from quarterback Zach Miller on the ground.

The Lions got their first score when Hinpeter hooked up with Mark Henderson on a two-yard pass which cut the score to 10-7, with four minutes left in the second quarter. The Lions would go into the locker room, however, trailing 30-7.

A different team emerged for the third quarter as on the opening kickoff, the Lions recovered a fumble deep in UNO territory and promptly scored on a one-yard run from Adam Hinpeter, making the score 30-14. A five-yard run from Henderson on Southern's next possession cut the Maverick lead to nine (30-21), but that would be the closest the Lions would get.

The Mavericks added a 30-yard field goal from Zuerlein in the fourth, as well as a 30-yard pass from Miller to Kelvin Nesbit.

Southern came into the game averaging 229 yards per game on the ground, but the defense from UNO limited the Lions to just 80 yards rushing on the night. The Mavericks also had two touchdowns called back because of penalties.

Hinpeter was 17-38 for 135 yards, a touchdown and an interception on the night. He also ran for a score. Henderson caught a TD and ran for another. Jared Brawner led the Lions' defense with 11 tackles, eight solo, and a forced fumble. Corderial Collier had nine tackles, while Skyler Vandiver, Ishmael Underdown and Zach McFerren all had fumble recoveries.

Game 5 – Lions 19 - Emporia State 18 • September 27, 2008

Joplin, Mo. - The Missouri Southern football team got huge games on both sides of the ball as Jared Brawner had 15 tackles with an interception and Toderick Hunt had three rushing touchdowns in a 19-18 road win at Emporia State today.

Southern (3-2, 1-2 MIAA) trailed early as Emporia State (3-2, 1-2 MIAA) picked up three first quarter field goals from Matt Perry to take a quick 9-0 lead.

Southern got on the board early in the second quarter to cut the lead to two. After a Fred Smith Kickoff return for 37 yards, the Lions set up shop with the ball at their own 47. Hunt had carries for 12 and 11 yards to start the drive and scored on an 18 yard scamper for the first of his three touchdowns on the day.

Emporia scored on their first play from scrimmage on the next drive to bring the lead to 15-7 and that would be how the score looked heading into halftime.

Southern came out and dominated the third quarter, scoring on their first possession when Hunt scored on a two yard carry. Both teams punted on their next possessions, but Terrance Scott picked up a fumble by ESU's Seville Ko and ran for 43 yards to the Emporia two-yard line setting up Hunt's third touchdown of the game.

Perry hit his fourth field goal of the game to bring the Hornets to within one at 19-18 with ten minutes remaining in the fourth, but that's when the Southern defense took over. The Lions forced Emporia to a four and out on its final three possessions, stopping two different fourth down attempts. They held the Hornets to zero yards in their final three possessions to seal the Lions' first MIAA win of the season.

Hunt had 133 yards on 24 carries with three scores. That was the second time this season the junior has scored three rushing touchdowns in a game. Adam Hinspeter was 12-20 on the afternoon connecting with six different receivers on passes. The senior also went over 8,000 yards passing in his career, giving him 8,076 in his career and is only the third person in MIAA history to accomplish the feat, joining Missouri Western's Kasey Waterman and Truman's Eric Howe.

Brawner had 15 tackles, including 10 solo and an interception. Justin Cowper added 11 tackles, nine solo, as well as four tackles for a loss of 26 yards and a sack. The Lions had two sacks on the afternoon, an interception and a fumble recovery. It was the first fumble Emporia had given up all season.

Joplin, Mo. - The Missouri Southern defense gave up only one offensive touchdown and allowed just 254 yards of total offense, but were shutout 23-0 today by Washburn at homecoming in front of more than 6,300 fans at Fred G. Hughes Stadium.

The Lions (3-3, 1-3 MIAA) and Ichabods (4-2, 2-2 MIAA) traded possessions in the first quarter as neither offense moved the ball consistently with the exception of one possession for Washburn that resulted in a missed 37 yard field goal.

The Ichabods got on the board with 4:43 left in the second quarter when Brad Cole returned a tipped pass from Adam Hinspeter for 30 yards for the game's first score. Washburn got the ball back late in the quarter and drove the field when Ichabod quarterback Josh Iverson completed a pass to Ryan Mertz at the Southern eight yard line with seven seconds left. He got up to the line and spiked the ball, however, the officials had yet to signal for play to begin, so the Bods were charged with a delay of game.

Washburn's Justin Cooper then rushed for seven yards to the Southern six yard line and it looked as if time had expired, however the officials ruled an Ichabod timeout had been called and put two seconds back on the clock, good enough for a 23 yard field goal from Garret Cummings, giving Washburn a 10-0 lead at the half.

Neither team scored in the third. The Ichabods picked up a 58 yard interception return from Casey Curran with 5:38 left in the fourth and a 16 yard run from Cooper with just under two minutes remaining. That proved to be the game's only offensive touchdown.

Both teams had 15 first downs, but the difference was on the ground where Washburn out gained the Lions 168-20. The Lions were penalized nine times for 55 yards and got past the 50 yard line just three times in the game, the furthest being the Washburn 38 yard line.

Adam Hinspeter was 25-45 for 183 yards passing with two interceptions. Johnny Johnson had nine catches for 80 yards, while Renard Johnson had eight carries for 41 yards.

Defensively, the Lions shined today. Skyler Vandiver had 12 tackles, including a half a sack and 1.5 tackles for a loss of six yards. Jared Brawner had 10 tackles, a half a sack and two pass breakups. Corderial Collier and Dusty Bratzler each had nine tackles, while Bratzler picked up a sack for a loss of 14 yards. He had 1.5 tackles for a loss of 17 yards on the afternoon. Jairius Jarvis and Brandon Williams each had a sack.

Game 7 – Lions 28 @ Fort Hays State 0 • October 11, 2008

**Hays, Kan.** - The Missouri Southern defense pitched its second straight shutout of Fort Hays State in as many years, as the Lions defeated the Tigers 28-0 today in front of just over 1,900 fans at Lewis Field Stadium.

Southern (4-3, 2-3 MIAA) won its second road MIAA game of the year for the first time since the 2004 season when the Lions defeated Missouri-Rolla, Truman and Southwest Baptist all on the road. It is the third straight shutout in the series with Fort Hays (2-5, 1-4 MIAA) as the Tigers blanked Southern 10-0 two years ago and the Lions have won the last two (6-0 and 28-0).

The Lions' defense helped put Southern on the board first when Justin Cowper intercepted an Anthony Smith pass and returned it to the Hays' 33 yard line. Adam Hinspeter hooked up with Mark Henderson on the first play from scrimmage and found the receiver at the three yard line. Henderson stayed on his feet and fought his way to the goal line for a 33 yard touchdown.

Southern forced Hays' second turnover of the day when long snapper Brian Borgard popped the Tigers' CJ Lovett on a punt return and forced the fumble, while tight end Chris Bingham came up with the recovery, giving the Lions the ball on the Fort Hays 31 yard line.

The Lions defense forced their third turnover of the half when Jared Brawner recovered a fumble at the Tigers' 15 yard line. Southern took advantage and Colin Howard ran a fake reverse, handed off to Daniel Thompson and Thompson ran 15 yards for the touchdown, putting Southern up 14-0, heading into the locker room.

The Lions picked up their third touchdown of the game when Collin Howard ran for his fourth rushing TD of the season, a 30 yard scamper in the third quarter. Hinspeter and Henderson hooked up again early in the fourth quarter on a 15-yard score to give the Lions a 28-0 lead. Hinspeter was 8-21 on the day with 111 yards and two touchdowns. The two scores give Hinspeter 58 in his career and moves him into a tie for sixth place all-time in the MIAA in career touchdowns. He is now six touchdowns from tying Matt Cook (64) for the Southern career mark.

Howard led the Lions with 77 yards rushing and a touchdown. Henderson caught five passes for 93 yards and two scores, while Thompson added a 15 yard rushing score. Brian Malette made all four extra point attempts and has 36 consecutive pat's.

The Lions' defense was led again by Jared Brawner. The junior linebacker tied a career high with 16 tackles, including three for a loss of seven yards and one fumble recovery. Jarius Jarvis had eight tackles with two for a loss, while Cowper had an interception and a pass breakup. The Lions as a team, had 11 tackles for a loss of 31 yards, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and an interception.

Game 8 – Central Missouri 47 - @ Lions 14 • October 18, 2008

**Joplin, Mo.** - The Missouri Southern football team came into the game as the nation's second rated passing defense, allowing just over 120 yards per game, but Central Missouri put up 361 yards in the air and defeated the Lions, 47-14 today in front of more than 2,700 fans at Hughes Stadium.

Southern (4-4, 2-4 MIAA) fell behind 23-0 mid way through the second quarter before redshirt freshman quarterback Colin Howard hooked up with Mark Henderson for a seven yard touchdown score. It was Howard's first career passing touchdown.

Central (6-2, 4-2 MIAA) scored early and quick as all four scoring drives were 2:38 or shorter, including two that were less than 15 seconds. The Mules went up 10-0 after a 28 yard field goal from Mark Starks in the second quarter and Starks came through on the ensuing kickoff as Central executed a perfect onside kick. The Mules recovered and quarterback Eric Czerniewski hooked up with Tim Richmond for a 47 yard score to push the lead to 17-0.

Southern attempted a fake punt on its next drive, but couldn't get the first down and Czerniewski this time found Sean Thornton on the first play of the drive for a 48 yard passing score. The Mules took a 23-7 lead into the locker room at the half.

The Mules added a field goal and a two yard rush from Glenn Milner to go up 40-7 in the fourth quarter. Southern forced Central to a punting situation early in the fourth, but Jordan Hofer's punt was short and caught a Southern player in the back and the Mules recovered on their own 45 yard line. Central added a 37 yard touchdown pass from Tommy Corwin to Thornton to go up 47-7 at that point.

The Lions responded on their next drive when Howard and Henderson hooked up for their second touchdown pass of the day, this time a 47 yarder to the left side of the end zone.

Central came into the game averaging 135 yards on the ground per game, but the Lions held the Mules to just 96 on the day. However, it was through the air where Central did its damage putting up 361 yards on the MIAA's best pass defense. Both teams were hampered by penalties as Southern had 11 penalties for 93 yards and Central posted eight for 95.

Howard, seeing his first extended action of his career, played the entire second half and went 10-17 in the air for 176 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 70 yards on 19 carries for 3.7 per attempt. Henderson caught five passes for 107 yards and two scores, while Toderick Hunt had 23 carries for 67 yards.

Brian Malette converted on both of his extra point attempts. That gives him 27 consecutive this season and he ended last season with 11 consecutive PAT's. The 38 consecutive ties a Missouri Southern career record that he shares with Rick Larrimore.

Jared Brawner had a team high nine tackles, including one pass breakup. Justin Cowper had six tackles, while Dusty Brazler, Skyler Vandiver and Josh Woodard all added five apiece.

Kirkville, Mo. - Missouri Southern's offense struggled today and the Truman State University Bulldogs used 28 second half points to defeat the Lions, 38-7 in Kirkville.

Southern (4-6, 2-6 MIAA) started the game on the right foot with Fred Smith taking the opening kickoff back 49-yards to the Truman (4-5, 3-5 MIAA) 46 yard line. The drive was short lived, however, as Truman's Robert Massop picked off an Adam Hinpeter pass. The Bulldogs would make the turnover hurt and they ended a nine play, 61-yard drive with a 15-yard touchdown run from Phil Kenney.

Truman added a 27-yard Mickey Masucci field goal to make the score 10-0 with 3:36 left in the first quarter. Neither team moved the ball well in the second quarter, but the Lions were threatening as the half was coming to an end and moved the ball to the Truman 27-yard line. Southern converted a fourth down on the drive, but the Bulldogs would stop the threat as Matt Burel intercepted a Hinpeter pass at the 10-yard line.

Southern had eight penalties for 60 yards in the first half, including a 61-yard punt return from Johnny Johnson called back due to a block in the back.

Truman came into the game averaging 103 yards per game on the ground, but the Bulldogs rushed for 200 yards in the first half, including 112 yards from Anton Bernard, becoming the first 100-yard rusher for Truman this season. In contrast, Ticich came into the game averaging 217 yards per game through the air, but the junior completed just 2-10 passes for 12 yards in the first half. The second half was much different for Ticich, as he completed nine of his first 11 passes 138 yards and three touchdowns putting the Bulldogs up 31-0 with 13 minutes left in the fourth quarter.

The Lions added a touchdown pass from Hinpeter to Isaac Norman before Truman backup quarterback Phillip Davis hooked up with Deotis Brown for the games' final score.

Hinpeter went 29-46 for 303 yards and a touchdown today. He currently has 8,817 yards passing, placing him 280 yards from second place in the MIAA. Hinpeter has 8,693 yards of total offense, putting him just 108 yards away from tying Josh Chapman's school record of 8,801.

Johnny Johnson had a career game catching nine passes for 130 yards, while Norman caught seven for 80 yards and a touchdown. Brian Malette placed himself among the kicking elite in Southern history connecting on his only point after attempt of the day, but it gave him 39 consecutive PAT's and placed him atop the Southern record books.

Jared Brawner had a game-high 12 tackles in the game with a pass break up. Corderial Collier had ten tackles and Brandon Williams had a career-high nine stops.
