All students are required to earn 60 credit hours from a four-year institution. The Area "Met/Not Met" indicator shows whether all the area requirements are satisfied. This includes all course requirements in the area, any area GPA requirements, minimum grade requirements, etc.

The Major GPA area will combine all courses completed in the major department, all supporting requirements for the major, and all elective requirements for the major into one area. The minimum GPA will be listed. Major courses that were taken but not successfully completed will also appear here. If the student has taken ANY courses required for the major, the "Met" column will show as "Yes". However, in order to meet the Major GPA requirement, the Area indicator must also show as "Met" (circled in red).

All majors require that one-half of the Upper-Division requirements be completed at MSSU. This area checks for all Upper Division courses completed in the major department.

Following all major and minor areas, there is an area for other courses and electives. This area contains all courses that were not used anywhere else in the evaluation.

The Other Courses/Electives area shows courses which do not satisfy requirements for the Core Curriculum or the student's major or minor. These courses count toward the total hours for graduation, overall GPA, and other degree requirements such as computer literacy, writing intensive, and upper division hours. If the student earned an F in a course that is outside the major department and has not repeated the course, it will appear here.

The last section of the CAPP Degree Evaluation is Degree Requirements (for baccalaureate degrees only). This section contains groups that check for overall degree requirements including the Missouri Constitution requirement, computer literacy requirement, writing intensive requirement, and upper division level hours. Group : Writing Intensive Requirement - Not Met
Description: Five Writing Intensive "WI" courses are required of all Baccalaureate Degree candidates. The required courses are ENG 101 and ENG 102 or ENG 111. Two of the three remaining required courses must be upper division with one of the upper division courses being in the major. Students transferring to Missouri Southern from another college with 30 or more hours must see the Registrar's Office to have an adjustment made to this requirement.

1. *Met* - indicates whether a requirement is 'Met' or 'Not Met'.
2. *Condition* - a logic statement that will appear as 'AND' or 'OR' or blank. If it is blank or has an 'AND' in front, it is a required element. An 'OR' indicates an option. Most requirements use 'AND' conditions.
3. *Rule* - indicates a requirement that includes several choices. There will be text explaining the student's options.
4. *Subject* - the subject code for the course requirement. If a rule is used, the description of the rule appears instead.
5. *Attribute* - some requirements will look for attribute codes that are attached to courses. If one of those attributes is a requirement, it will appear in this column.
6. *Low* - the lowest level course number that would be acceptable. If the requirement is a single course and not a range of courses, this is where the course number appears.
7. *High* - the highest level course number accepted if the requirement is a range of courses.
8. *Required Credits* - lists the number of credit hours required for the course.
9. *Required Courses* - listed the number of courses required.
10. *Term* - lists the term in which the courses were taken to fulfill the requirement.
11. *Subject* - lists the subject code of the course that fulfilled the requirement.
12. *Course* - lists the course number for the course(s) that fulfilled the requirement.
13. *Title* - lists the title of the course that fulfilled the requirement.
14. *Attribute* - list the attribute of the course that fulfilled the requirement (if required).
15. *Credits* - lists the number of credit hours of the course that met the requirement.
16. *Grade* - lists the grade earned in the course that met the requirement.
17. *Source* - indicates where in the item that satisfied the requirement is located in the system:

E	Exam – The requirement is fulfilled by an actual exam or an exam code. The “E” code is used for Core Curriculum requirements that are met by prior degrees, requirements such as C-BASE, PRAXIS, foreign language proficiency and immersion, and piano proficiency exams.
H	History – The courses the student takes at MSSU are referred to as Institutional History. An “H” appears in the source column only for courses taken at MSSU. These courses are used to calculate total institutional hours.
T	Transfer – All transfer courses appear with a source code of “T”.
R	Registered – The “R” code appears for courses that are currently in progress, and if the evaluation is for a future term for which the student has already registered for, it will include those classes as well. CAPP assumes the student will satisfactorily complete the courses in which he or she is currently registered and that none of these are duplicates or exceed the maximum allowed toward degree requirements.
P	Waiver – This code will show when a requirement has been waived because of an approved petition.
