- Construction of the new Roy Blunt Health Science Innovation Center will begin in May 2024, concluding in the summer of 2026. This facility will include immersive learning environments and support services for the entire campus.

# STUDENT SUCCESS CENTER

Retaining and graduating students requires convenient access to support services. Students will not, by nature, actively look for help. Instead, assistance must be placed in their path where it cannot be ignored.

This is known as purposeful intervention.

Missouri Southern will create a new one-stop-shop for areas such as academic advising, career services, tutoring, and First-Year Experience. This facility will support the university's expanded efforts in student retention and graduation. A location on campus that is highly-visible and well-trafficked will be identified and renovated to house the new Student Success Center.





# **BSC ACTIVITY CENTER**

The lower level of Billingsly Student Center will be remodeled to create a new campus gathering space for students – a place for them to relax, have fun, and build friendships.

Contained in the space will be electronic gaming systems, flat screen TVs, pool and ping pong tables, a stage for performances, and much more. A variety of comfortable seating (booths, bean-bag chairs, high-top tables, etc.) will create a welcoming environment that encourages conversations and engagement. In addition, a snack bar will serve students' favorite food and beverages, potentially including beer-on-tap to those over the age of 21.

Creating a space where students can socialize enhances the overall student experience. Giving students the opportunity to create lasting and treasured memories is important.

# ATHLETIC EXCELLENCE FUND

Even before a student-athlete sets foot on a field or court, Missouri Southern must be successful in recruiting. In the MIAA, this means having facilities and support services that turn the heads of the most talented DII student-athletes in the nation. After they've signed on to become Lions, those same facilities and support services ensure the greatest likelihood of academic and physical eligibility, competitiveness against the university's MIAA peers, and help retain those student-athletes through graduation.

# **ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE**

MSSU is keenly focused on identifying emerging programs that are at the convergence of student interest and employer demand. Examples of these new programs include sports and recreation management, healthcare administration, biomedical sciences, data analytics and more. Donor support in this area is very important because it allows these new programs to grow until they can become self-sustaining.

Endowed faculty positions provide a basis of ongoing funding that allows Missouri Southern to recruit and retain the brightest minds to teach our students. For example, a \$500,000 endowed professorship will generate \$20,000 annually to enhance the base salary provided by the university along with funding for academic research, travel, and equipment. This additional level of salary and research support is needed to recruit a rising star in key academic disciplines.

# IMMERSIVE LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

Today, students are seeking an educational experience beyond the classroom. Employers are seeking graduates with experiences directly relevant to their profession. Together, these forces have signaled a greater emphasis in higher education on firsthand experiences outside the traditional classroom setting. This includes opportunities such as:

- Purchasing the next generation of academic technology, including virtual reality equipment, allows MSSU to continue to be a leader in immersive learning.
- Providing travel and living expenses will support the university's international mission through the study abroad program. Missouri Southern has exchange agreements in over a dozen countries to provide potentially life-changing experiences for our students.
- The Global Leaders program is an opportunity for fifty of the university's highest achieving students to each receive a \$4,000 stipend to participate in leadership development, international travel, undergraduate research, or professional conferences.
- An angel investment fund is the perfect complement to the launch of our new entrepreneurship degree program. Students needing access to funds from this endowment will participate in a pitch competition and may receive funding to help launch their business.

ROY BLUNT HEALTH
SCIENCE INNOVATION CENTER

The State of Missouri has made a dollar-for-dollar match available for this project up to \$15 million. Missouri Southern is seeking \$9 million in private philanthropic support to access a portion of that match.

Missouri Southern will construct a "best in class" education and training facility that will strengthen the university's position as a leader in the health sciences and advance collaborative relationships with regional partners. The Roy Blunt Health Science Innovation Center will facilitate the growth and development of critical health science programs.

The Roy Blunt Health Science Innovation Center will contain:

- simulation hospital (fully equipped to simulate real-world scenarios);
- radiological technology laboratory (CT scan and ultrasound suite, X-ray room);
- expanded cadaver lab to meet the demand for hands-on training; and
- collaborative research laboratories.

The Roy Blunt Health Science Innovation Center will also include a welcome center and conference space as a new "front door" for the university's prospective students.

The Roy Blunt Health Science **Innovation Center** will not only open the door for providing excellence in nursing and healthcare education but will also serve the community when highly trained graduates enter the workforce.
