Call to Order: President-Elect Hughes called the meeting to order at 9:00 am.

**Approval of Minutes**: Senator Case motioned to approve the minutes and was seconded by Senator Adams. Meeting Minutes were approved.

# Administrative / Special Guest Comments:

**President's Cabinet**: Linda Eis was present for the PC report. The following were the topics presented:

- New MKEAP expansion with KCU for a Dental Program. MKEAP stands for the Missouri Southern State University/Kansas City University Early Acceptance Program. This program will operate similarly to the former YTL program, which is also being referred to as MKEAP Medical.
- There is a new Capital Campaign starting. It has identified seven areas that had the most interest from our foundation donors for support.
- Census is this coming Friday (Sept. 16). There are encouraging numbers for the new student population.
- MOSO Connect with the Dental Hygiene program is coming up.
- Town Hall is next Thursday (Sept 22). Will have updated enrollment reports.
- If any staff member did not get a tumbler at the Welcome Back meeting, they are located in HR. Please be sure to stop by and get one.
- Insurance Open Enrollment is coming up in October. They will be sending updated to campus regarding that as well as other changes coming with the switch. The Wellness Incentive credit will still be available with the new plan. There was a question asked regarding more detailed breakdown of expenses. Ms. Eis stated that all the insurance meetings are open to campus and suggested attending one of those to ask specific questions.

**Faculty Senate:** Amber Carr was present for the Faculty Senate Report. The following were topics presented:



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- There have been some issues on Degree Works with the degree audit.
- Faculty Senate President Elect may have to change. Per the handbook, the President-Elect must be teaching faculty. A discussion was started but tabled to allow Amber Carr to continue as the President-Elect.
