MSSU Athletics Report

1. Sport Program Reports

- Men's Basketball The Missouri Southern men's basketball team is 14-11 and 11-8 in the MIAA. They are in fourth place in the MIAA. Taevaunn Prince has been named to the Bevo Francis Small College Player of the Year Watch list. He has made the first cut of 50 players with another cut of 25 coming in March. Finalists announced April 1. Prince currently leads Division II in free throw attempts, free throws made, points per game and total points.
- Women's Basketball The Missouri Southern women's basketball team sits at 16-9 overall and 10-9 in the MIAA. They sit in 6th place in the MIAA at the moment. They have a road game this weekend at Central Missouri. The top four teams in the standings get an automatic bye to Kansas City for the 2016 MIAA Tournament. Teams 5-8 host the 9-12 seeds in first-round games of the MIAA Tournament on Feb. 29.
- c. <u>Men's Track and Field</u> The MSSU men's track and field is in the middle of the indoor season. Vincent Kiprop broke the 3k record this week running an 8:20.26 in the event to win at Pitt State. Kennan Harrison also won the triple jump at Pitt. The team will be in action this weekend sending athletes to both the University of Nebraska and Central Missouri.
- d. <u>Women's Track and Field –</u> The MSSU women's track and field team had a successful meet this past weekend at Pittsburg State, breaking two school records. Melanie Bower broke the pole vault record with a jump of 13-01.75. That mark ranks 4th nationally. She was also named the MIAA Women's Field Athlete of the Week. Kaylee Morgan also broke a record, jumping 19-01.25 in the long jump, breaking a 21-year old mark. The team will be in action this weekend sending athletes to both the University of Nebraska and Central Missouri.
- e. <u>Baseball</u>— The MSSU baseball team is ranked No. 15 Nationally this week. The Lions started the season 4-0 this past weekend, sweeping a four-game series from Bemidji State at Warren Turner Field. Payton Walker and Joe Paulino were named the MIAA Pitcher and Player of the Week, respectively. The Lions host McKendree University this weekend.
- f. <u>Softball</u> The MSSU Softball team is off to a 4-5 overall record this year. The Lions host Missouri S&T this Saturday.
- g. <u>Golf</u> Taylor Lansford finished tied for 11th as the Lions competed at the San Antonio Shootout this past Monday and Tuesday. The Lions finished tied for 10th as a team. Southern will be back in action on March 7-8 at the Arkansas Tech Invitational.

2. MIAA News:

- a. <u>MIAA Legislation and Handbook committee</u>. FAR Council will review the handbook annually. All the changes as presented were accepted by the CEO Council.
- **b.** <u>Bylaw changes</u>: The CEO Council voted to discontinue the restrictions on the 75% sports by allowing all the programs to be fully funded equivalency scholarship wise at the NCAA minimum. This was not supported by MSSU due to current financial climate with in the state for funding of Higher Education.
- c. <u>Scheduling Issues</u>: One committees that was formed to review the 22 game basketball schedule as well as the 2017 & 2018 Football Schedules met in Kansas City and it was determined to have a random draw for fb scheduling and to not include rival weeks. The basketball schedule was determined to go to 19

games. These proposed changes were supported by the AAD on a conference call and thus approved. In addition, it was voted to not approve any scheduling changes for basketball for 2 years.

3. NCAA News:

- a. NCAA Reporting:
 - i. The NCAA Agreed Upon Procedures Audit was completed and the final report was accepted by the institution. There were no findings; which is truly and incredible feat. Clearly many people on campus have taken great time and effort to be accurate and detailed when working with the athletic department and the NCAA.
- **b.** <u>Potential Division 2 Legislation:</u> A comprehensive survey was sent out by the NCAA to be distributed to those on campus impacted by athletic financial aid (i.e. Countable Aid). It is intended for the president, coaches, athletic staff, financial aid, senior leadership, etc.
- c. <u>NCAA ISSG (Institutional Self Study Guide)</u>: Per the NCAA, the Gender Equity Committee will be meeting bi-monthly to review, and make recommendations when needed, our action plans that were implemented during the ISSG in 2013.
