Report of the Faculty Liaison to the Board of Governors

The Faculty Senate met on May 1, 2017. The following is a summary of the issues discussed and votes taken at that meeting:

## Old Business

The Faculty Senate was presented proposals for changes to the Faculty Handbook for the second reading. All proposals passed the second reading and they are summarized below:

## FHC Proposal 2016-2017.005—Regular and Substantive Feedback in DL courses

RE: Chapter 8, V. Course Policy Statements (p58)
It is the recommendation of the Distance Learning Committee, and the Academic Policies Committee that the handbook be changed to add the following statement:

For online course syllabi only: A description of course activities (of which substantive instructor feedback, including individual student feedback must be a part) through which students can expect to interact with their instructor and the time frame in which these activities will occur.

## 2016-2017.006 - Representation Formula

RE: Chapter 2, Section I, Article IV. The Faculty Senate, Section 4: Representation Formula and Membership (p.11)

## Old Language:

The representation by department shall be based upon the number of Voting Faculty. The following formula shall be used:

One representative for each department with three to twenty Voting Faculty members; two representatives for each department with twenty-one or more Voting Faculty members.

## New Language

The representation by department shall be based upon the number of Voting Faculty. The following formula shall be used:

One representative for each department with three to fourteen Voting Faculty members; two representatives for each department with fifteen or more Voting Faculty members.

Proposal Passed.

## Proposal FHC 2016-2017:008. SCOC Representation

RE: Chapter 2, Section II, Article III. Faculty Senate Committees B, The Academic Policies Committee and the School Curriculum Oversight Committees (p.16)

Each of the SCOCs will have specific voting members and Graduate council was removed as a SCOC. One SCOC for each of the four schools, every department will have a SCOC representative. Each SCOC has 3 voting members, but may have more members for discussion and debate. However, additional members are non-voting. Each SCOC has 3 voting members, except Arts \& Sciences, which has 7 because of its larger size.
