Faculty qualifications

When faculty members do not possess the academic degrees required to meet the Higher Learning Commission's faculty qualifications, "tested experience" may be used to determine minimally qualified faculty. The process includes a review of academic transcripts, resume or curriculum vita, or portfolio, and a memo which addresses the criteria provided below:

Breadth & Depth of Experience: Faculty possesses five years of experience in a position of leadership, with significant professional autonomy, and/or in which the individual was empowered with discretion over organizational resources and strategic directions. This experience is directly relevant to the subject matter and discipline in which the faculty member is providing instruction.

Skill Set: Faculty possesses a skill set which is current, relevant, and consistent with the subject matter and discipline being taught.

Non-Degree Credentials: Faculty possesses current certifications, licensures, registrations and/or credentialing by external bodies, including determination of qualifications by discipline-specific accreditors and regulatory bodies.

Professional Impact: Despite the lack of a relevant graduate degree(s), the faculty member has made contributions of an impactful nature beyond the geographic region and has positively influenced other practices or practitioners in the field.

Review and approval for determining faculty qualifications using tested experience begins with the Department Chair, proceeds to the Dean, with final determination residing with the Provost.




Disney Internship Program: Missouri Southern is developing an internship in conjunction with Walt Disney World. Walt Disney World maintains approximately 4,000 interns at any given time and we have been invited to participate as a University in this endeavor.

Our students will go through a rigorous application process under the direction of Walt Disney World. Those students selected will live on Disney property in apartments designed specifically for interns. They



will enroll in an internship at Missouri Southern for 3-9 hours, dependent on their choice, and will be assigned responsibilities and roles by the Disney Internship staff. Each student will also enroll in a three credit hour BIEX course at MSSU which will align with a Collegiate/ACE accredited, course taught by terminally degree qualified faculty at Walt Disney World. At the completion of the internship the student will have the potential to have earned 12 credit hours.

Interns will be supervised by an MSSU faculty member and all grades will be the University's responsibility.
