Annual History Day competitions on tap at MSSU, NEO

Mar 5, 2016More than 200 entries have been submitted for this year's regional History Day competition, which is slated for Friday at Missouri Southern State University.

Students in the competition explore any aspect of world, American or local history pertaining to the annual theme. Their entries must use relevant primary and secondary sources and assess the topic's significance in history.

Entries can be a research paper, an exhibit, a performance, a website or a documentary presented as a video or PowerPoint.

The public is invited to view students' exhibits, which will be on display in Connor Ballroom on the third floor of Billingsly Student Center, and performances and documentaries, to be presented in various rooms on the second floor of Webster Hall.

Judges will include Missouri Southern faculty and volunteers from the community who have a special interest in history. Judging begins at 9 a.m.; awards ceremonies are scheduled for approximately 3 p.m.

Winners from the regional contest, which is one of nine in Missouri, will have the opportunity to compete in National History Day in Missouri on April 30 at the University of Missouri-Columbia. Winners from the state competition could be eligible to advance to the National History Day contest in June at College Park, Maryland.

Participating schools are Appleton City, Carthage, College Heights Christian School, Joplin, Mount Vernon, Neosho, Neosho Christian School, Nevada, Seneca and Wheaton. Students must be in grades six through 12 to participate.

Meanwhile, approximately 60 students from six schools in Northeast Oklahoma are expected to compete Tuesday in History Day in the Calcagno Family Ballroom at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College in Miami. Winners from that competition will attend the state contest in Oklahoma City in early May for a chance to compete in the national contest in Maryland.

"Students who participate in History Day have a great opportunity to learn not just dry facts and dates but about the personal stories of real people and events," David Loving, history instructor and National History Day coordinator, said in a statement. "Many of our local schools have really embraced the contest and are producing excellent projects with very thorough research. I'm excited by the number of quality projects that have gone on to be successful in the state competition."
