October marks the beginning of Year 3 for our Title III grant, and momentum continues to build across all initiatives. Programs are transitioning from foundational development to strategic implementation, with SEP presentations underway for Math, Technology, and Education pathways. The RN to BSN project is expanding its outreach, supported by newly distributed promotional materials. Food Science and Nutrition celebrates its inaugural cohort and finalized lab space, while Agribusiness faculty are leveraging recent training to refine curriculum and boost enrollment. As we move into this new phase, collaboration and innovation remain central to our progress.

YEAR 3 OBJECTIVES

- By Fall 2026, at least 75% of Year 1 Agribusiness students will earn grades of C+/.
- By Fall 2026, at least 75% of Year 2 Food Science students will earn grades of C+/.
- By Fall 2026, at least 75% of Year 2 online RN-BSN students will earn grades of C+/.
- By Fall 2026, at least 75% of Summer Bridge 8 wk. program (with remedial Math) pilot students will achieve success measures defined in development.
- By Fall 2026, at least 75% of students in Meta Majors/Degree Mapping Year 2 pilot will declare meta-major with degree map.

Meta Majors / Degree Mapping

We've made exciting progress in supporting student academic planning! New SEP (Student Education Plan) templates are now available for the Math, Technology, and Education pathways. The student guide has been refreshed to reflect these updates, and SEP presentations are scheduled in UE 100 classes to help students get started early.

Online RN to BSN

The RN to BSN continues its outreach efforts including meetings with area healthcare professionals to introduce and educate them about the new program. To boost community awareness, program flyers are distributed across key locations.

Food Science and Nutrition

The Food Science and Nutrition (FSN) program is off to a strong start with 10 students enrolled in the introductory course. The lab space is finalized, ensuring students have access to hands-on learning opportunities throughout the semester.

Summer Bridge

The Summer Bridge Program successfully concluded with 23 of 24 seats filled and strong student engagement from day one. A post-program survey revealed outstanding outcomes—100% of participants felt prepared for college, 90% felt connected to the campus community, and 100% said the program met their expectations.

Agribusiness

Progress continues in launching the Agribusiness program. Faculty participated in orientation and completed Title III training to align with institutional goals. Collaborative curriculum development is continuing, and new materials have been created to support student enrollment and outreach efforts.
