# **VPSA Updates**

- Talent Search was funded for a 5-year period (more than \$1.3 million). The Talent Search program identifies and assists individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds who have the potential to succeed in higher education. The program provides academic, career, and financial counseling to its participants and encourages them to graduate from high school and continue on to and complete their postsecondary education. Current schools include Carthage, Joplin, Carl Junction, Webb City, Riverton, & Sarcoxie.
- Missouri Department of Higher Education Default Prevention Grant was renewed for 2016-2017 (\$25,000).
- Student Activities and Recreation departments have been merged into the Student Life department Landon Adams will serve as the Director of Student Life.
- **Residence Halls are over capacity** Capacity is 879 occupants. We currently have 935 occupants.
- Wellness Committee A Wellness Committee/Partners in Prevention Coalition has been formed. This committee features a variety of campus representatives and will focus on implementing the employee wellness plan developed in cooperation with Gallagher & Company. In addition, this group will be responsible for developing and implementing the Partners in Prevention Strategic Plan.
- Community Day, August 24, 2016 Sponsored by Career Services, with volunteers from across campus. This event has 131 community businesses and organizations participating.

# **Financial Aid**

• Packaged Students 4,891 (approximately 500 increase)

State Aid

- Access MO 1,330 pending @ \$1,438,630 for Fall
- Bright Flight 45 pending @\$65,850 for Fall
- Have certified 195 veterans for VA Benefits already this fall. More will be expected.
- Student Employment has approx. 30 on-campus positions available currently for the fall semester

- Financial Aid has introduced a Financial Literacy curriculum to students who are on Financial Aid Suspension status. USA Funds LifeSkills lessons are available to these students on topics related to budgeting, credit card debt, goal-setting, and student-loan repayment.
- Early FAFSA filing will be encouraged this fall for the 2017-18 Academic Year. October 1, 2016 instead of January 1, 2017 will move our processes up about three months.

# First Year Experience

- UE 100 Classes
  - o 1,132 students are currently enrolled in UE 100
  - Approximately 300 freshmen attended the First Year Student Convocation on Saturday, August 20<sup>th</sup>.
- Southern Welcome Summer Orientation
  - o 860 freshmen enrolled
  - o 100 transfer students enrolled

#### **Student Success Center (SSC)**

- Tutoring begins on Monday, August 29 (2<sup>nd</sup> week of classes)
- Conducting six UE 150 (Academic Skills Classes)
- Student Success Center is currently working on partnerships with Biology, Kinesiology, Project Stay, and Math.

# **Career Services**

- Sixth Performance Measure All institutions would use the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) survey.
  - o MSSU must have verifiable employment data on 60% of the graduates.
  - The overall career outcomes rate (employed + service + military + continuing education) benchmark will be 73.4%.

#### **Student Life**

- Campus Activities Board
  - o Lion Pride Weekend was a huge success. Events included:
    - Captain America: Civil War 153 unique student scans. 79.7% were Resident Students. 67% were freshmen.
    - Glo-ga Party 257 unique student scans. 76.7% were Resident Students. 61.8% were freshmen.
    - Campus Craze featuring Comedian: Jessi Campbell: 232 unique student scans. 62.1% were Resident Students. 52.6% were freshmen.
- Greek Life
  - o Currently, we have 36 women signed up for Sorority Recruitment.
- Registered Student Organizations Nearly 50 registered student organizations participated in Campus Craze on Sunday, August 21.
- Safe Zone
  - On August 17, the university's Resident Assistants underwent Safe Zone
    Training. In addition to the 40 Faculty and Staff Safe Zones on campus we now
    have our very first student Safe Zones (13).
