#### To sit for the CPA Examination in Missouri, a candidate must have

- (1) At least 150 hours of college education including a baccalaureate or higher degree and
- (2) A minimum of 60 hours in business, including 27 hours in accounting beyond the principles courses, 18 hours of which must be upper division (300-400 level courses). Requirements in other states vary.

\*Majors in accounting must earn a grade of 'C' or above in all accounting courses in order to earn a B.S.B.A.

\*\*Must be chosen with advisor approval. Internships and independent studies will not fulfill this requirement. Those interested in sitting for the CPA exam should consider: Advanced Accounting and Tax Accounting II. Those interested in sitting for the Certified Management Accounting exam should consider: Tax Accounting II and Advanced Cost Accounting.
