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General Information



General University Timeline

- 1937 Joplin Junior College is established under the supervision of the Extension Division of the University of Missouri and held in the Joplin High School Joplin and H.E. Blaine is named first Dean.
- 1964 The college adopts the official name of "Jasper County Junior College" under the direction of the Junior College District of Jasper County governed by a Board of Trustees.
- 1965 Legislation is passed creating the four year institution known as Missouri Southern College.
- **1967** The new 320-acre campus is opened under the direction of the first appointed president, Dr. Leon C. Billingsly.
- **1969** The college awarded first baccalaureate degrees to 198 students.
- 1972 The college is renamed Missouri Southern State College.
- 1977 Missouri Southern State College becomes a state assisted four-year college and part of the State of Missouri's higher education system gaining full state funding.
- 1978 Dr. Floyd Belk serves as interim President until Dr. Donald C. Darnton assumes the presidency in 1979.
- **1982 -** Dr. Julio Leon is appointed the president.
- 1992 Richard M. Webster Communications and Social Science Building is opened.
- 1995 Legislation is passed directing MSSC to add international emphasis to its mission, and the newly constructed Student Life Center is complete.
- 2003 Legislation is passed renaming the college to Missouri Southern State University-Joplin.
- **2006** The first group of students receives their master's degrees.
- **2007** Dr. Terri Agee is selected as interim president after Dr. Julio Leon announces his retirement.
- **2008 -** Dr. Bruce W. Speck is named president.
- **2009** The George S. Beimdiek Recreation Center and Willcoxon Student Health Center officially opened.
- 2010 The newly-renovated Mission Hills Mansion opens as the Ralph L. Gray Alumni Center along with the state-of-the-art Health Science building.
- **2012** The university begins a year-long celebration of its 75th anniversary.
- **2014** Dr. Alan D. Marble is appointed president after serving as interim.




ACT Score Range of Fall First-Time Students

Percent Of High School Rank of First-Time Students, **Fall 2015**



Percent of First-Time Students by High School GPA Range, **Fall 2015**





County of Origin Map of First-Time Students at Time of First Application, **Fall 2015**















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Differences in 1,5 & 10 Year Enrollment Trends



Place of Origin at First Application by State Map, Fall 2015 Enrollment















Fall First-Time, Full-Time Bachelor's Seeking Retention Rates









Undergraduate Student and Faculty FTE






In-State Tuition even outside of Missouri






Percent of Sources of Core Expenses, FY 2015





Glossary of Terms

25th percentile - The score at or below which 25 percent of students submitting test scores to an institution scored.

75th percentile - The score above which 25 percent of students submitting test scores to an institution scored.

Academic Rank - A status designated by the institution according to the institution's policies, such as Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor and Instructor.

Academic Year - The period of time generally extending from September to June.

Accrediting Agencies - Agencies that establish operating standards for educational or professional institutions and programs, determine the extent to which the standards are met, and publicly announce their findings.

ACT - The ACT® college readiness assessment is a curriculum- and standards-based educational and career planning tool, which measures educational development and readiness to pursue college-level coursework in English, mathematics, natural science, and social studies.

Adjunct Instructional Staff - Non-tenure track instructional staff serving in a temporary or auxiliary capacity to teach specific courses on a course-by-course basis. This includes either instructional staff that are hired to teach an academic degree-credit course and those hired to teach a remedial, developmental, or ESL course; whether the latter three categories earn college credit is immaterial.

Adjusted Cohort – Students who are excluded from the original cohort (or sub cohort) due to any allowable exclusion.

Admissions (students admitted) - Applicants that have been granted an official offer to enroll in a postsecondary institution.

Applicant (students applied) - An individual who has fulfilled the institution's requirements to be considered for admission (including payment or waiving of the application fee, if any) and who has been notified of one of the following actions: admission, non-admission, placement on waiting list, or application withdrawn by applicant or institution.

Census Date - The Census Date of the university represents a date in each semester when a "snapshot" of university data is reported. Data reported at Census represent the official enrollment for the semester.

Certificate - A formal award certifying the satisfactory completion of a postsecondary education program.

Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) - A six-digit code in the form xx.xxxx that identifies instructional program specialties within educational institutions.

Credit Hour - A unit of measure representing the equivalent of 15 class sessions consisting of 50 minutes of instruction. It is applied toward the total number of hours needed for completing the requirements of a degree, diploma, certificate, or other formal award.

Declared Major - Students who have declared their area of study and are enrolled in at least one course taken for credit anytime during the academic year. Students with a double major are counted in each area but only counted once in the college and university counts. Data are gathered each semester on Census Date.

Degree - An award conferred by a college, university, or other postsecondary education institution as official recognition for the successful completion of a program of study.

Degree/certificate-Seeking Students - Students enrolled in courses for credit and recognized by the institution as seeking a degree, certificate, or other formal award. High school students also enrolled in postsecondary courses for credit are not considered degree/certificate-seeking.

Exclusions - Those students who may be removed (deleted) from a cohort (or sub cohort). For the Graduation Rates and Fall Enrollment retention rate reporting, students may be removed from a cohort if they left the institution for one of the following reasons: death or total and permanent disability; service in the armed forces (including those called to active duty); service with a foreign aid service of the federal government, such as the Peace Corps; or service on official church missions.

Faculty - Persons whose specific assignments customarily are made for the purpose of conducting instruction, research, or public service as a principal activity (or activities), and who hold academic titles of professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, or the equivalent of any of these academic ranks.

Fall - The part of the academic year that begins between late August and November 1.

First-Time Student - Students who enroll in college for the first time. First-time students (FTST) are those who have earned no previous college credit hours, although those who earned college credits while in high school through dual credit are included as well as students who originally enter MSSU as non-degree seeking.

First-Time Student Retention Rate - The percent of first-time students who return for their sophomore year.

First-Time Transfer Student - Students who enroll at MSSU for the first time who have previously attended another postsecondary institution.

Fiscal Year (FY) - The period of time utilized for maintaining university financial records. It commences on July 1 and ends June 30 the following year.

Freshmen - Undergraduates who have earned fewer than 30 college semester credit hours.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Staff - The full-time-equivalent (FTE) of staff is calculated by summing the total number of full-time staff from the Employees by Assigned Position (EAP) component and adding one-third of the total number of part-time staff.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Graduate - All the credit hours taken by graduate students, divided by 12 per semester or 24 per academic year.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Undergraduate - All the credit hours taken by undergraduate students, divided by 15 per semester or 30 per academic year.

Full-Time Instructional Faculty - Individuals are included or excluded based on the instructions for reporting to government agencies, i.e., IPEDS.

Full-Time Student - A full-time student is a student who takes at least 12 credit hours (undergraduate) or 9 credit hours (graduate) in a specific semester.

Geographic Origin – The place a student resides at the time of first application to the institution.

Graduate - A student who holds a bachelor's or first-professional degree, or equivalent, and is taking courses at the post-baccalaureate level.

Graduation Rate - The percent of first-time students who graduate within a given period of time.

Headcount - Refers to the unduplicated count of students enrolled for one or more classes during the time period stated.

Junior – This is an undergraduate student who has earned at least 60 but fewer than 90 semester credit hours.

Major - A concentration of related courses generally consisting of 30 to 50 semester hours of credit. A student may have more than one major.

Non-Degree Seeking - A student enrolled in courses for credit that is not recognized by the institution as seeking a degree or formal award.

Nonresident Alien - A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States and who is in this country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely.

Part-Time Student - An undergraduate student enrolled with fewer than 12 credits in a semester or a graduate student enrolled in nine credit hours or less.

Program Category - A summary of groups of related instructional programs designated by the first 2 digits of its appropriate Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) code.

Race/Ethnicity - Categories used to describe groups to which individuals belong or identify with. A person may be counted in only one group.

Retention Rate - This is the percentage of first-time bachelor's degree-seeking undergraduates from the previous fall who are again enrolled in the current fall.

Senior - An undergraduate student who has accumulated at least 90 semester credit hours.

Sophomore - An undergraduate student who has accumulated at least 30 semester hours of credit, but fewer than 60 semester credit hours.

Summer - The part of the academic year that begins between late May and July.

Spring - The part of the academic year that begins between late January and March.

Student to Faculty Ratio – The ratio includes the total full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment of students divided by the total full-time equivalent (FTE) of instructional faculty.

Sub cohort - A predefined subset of the initial cohort or the revised cohort established for tracking purposes on the Graduation Rates (GR) component of IPEDS (e.g., bachelor's degreeseeking sub cohort.)

Tenure - Status of a personnel position with respect to permanence of the position.

Tuition and fees - The amount of tuition and required fees covering a full academic year most frequently charged to students. These values represent what a typical student would be charged and may not be the same for all students at an institution. If tuition is charged on a per-credithour basis, the average fulltime credit hour load for an entire academic year is used to estimate average tuition. Required fees include all fixed sum charges that are required of such a large proportion of all students that the student who does not pay the charges is an exception.

Undergraduate - A student enrolled in a 4- or 5-year bachelor's degree program, an associate's degree program, or a vocational or technical program below the baccalaureate.
